High School vs. College Test Preparation	
High School	College
Class attendance is enforced by the administration	Attendance is optional
Other people structure your time	You structure your time
Homework is a significant part of one's grade	Homework is either not significantly grade or not grades at all
Teachers remind you about turning in your work	Showing up for test are your sole responsibility
Teacher's guide studying	Students are self-directed in studying
Teachers give you second chances and sometimes allow retakes	No retakes
Teachers have time to review material.	There is usually not much time to review material in class.
Tests are frequent and cover one chapter.	Tests are infrequent and cover a large amount of material.
A student's effort is part of the grade.	Effort is necessary to learn, but is not directly graded.
A student may pass the class merely by attending every day.	Passing a course depends on test performance.
Mastering the material in math is necessary for success in the next math course.	Mastering the material in math is necessary for success in the next math course.
